100% of the board actively works to maintain the standards and regulations of the profession in the State of Illinois

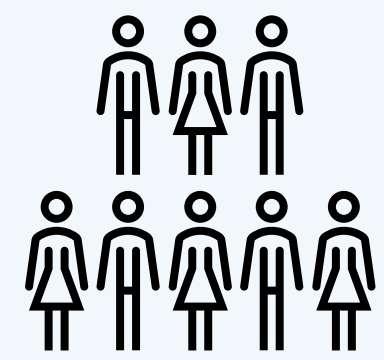

Board members shall be elected for a term of three years.

Primary Duties:

A) To direct the prudent use of funds and the effective management of the organization.

B) To administer and regulate a process of certification of Domestic Violence Professionals and Partner Abuse Intervention Professionals in the State of Illinois.

C) To set and enforce standards, including a Code of Ethics, for Certified Domestic Violence Professionals and Certified Partner Abuse Intervention Professionals.
